The UnitedHealthcare Children's Foundation (UHCCF) is a 501(c)(3) charitable organization that provides medical grants to help children gain access to health-related services not covered, or not fully covered, by their family's commercial health insurance plan.

#### Summarized Criteria

- Child is 16 years old or younger
- Must be covered by commercial Health Insurance Plan and benefits limits are either exceeded, no coverage is available, and/or the cost are a serious financial burden on the family.
- > Family financials are within these rates below on their IRS 1040 Gross Income

Family Size	Gross Income
2	\$50,000 or less
3	\$75,000 or less
4	\$100,000 or less
5 or more	\$125,000 or less

Since 2013, Small Steps in Speech (SSIS) has been honored to partner with Childhood Apraxia of Speech Association of North America (CASANA) to award grants for speech therapy to families of children with apraxia. Summarized Criteria

- Children between the ages of 3 to 22. Please note when applying the child must be 3 years age at the time of the application deadline (February 1, May 1, August 1, November 1).
- Grants are not based solely on financial need; however, applications will not be accepted for a joint family income more than \$125,000.

Suzy Foundation is a non-profit organization providing therapy or technology assistance for different aspects of special needs children. Summarized Criteria

- > Child must be 17 years old or younger.
- > Letter or prescriptions from doctor confirming the need for the requested assistive device or therapy
- > Letter of denial from parent/guardian's insurance company

ACT Today! grants are designed to provide access to individuals and families affected by Autism Spectrum Disorders. Grant payments will be made directly to pre-approved treatment providers, assessors or materials vendors.

Summarized Criteria

- > There is not an income cap however incomes below \$100,000 will be reviewed first.
